SHOW RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules and Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. **Entry Fee:** \$65.00/entry. **Tie-Out Fee:** \$20.00/head. **GST payable on all fees.**
3. **Eligible Cattle:**
 - A) Beef Shorthorn, Lincoln Red and Dual Purpose Shorthorn - all purebred males and females.
 - B) Graded up Shorthorns of registered status. (87.5% 7/8 Females, 93.8% 15/16 Males).
4. **Scanning:** Will be the option of the exhibitor, at the exhibitor's expense.
5. Any Shorthorns shown at Agribition are subject to parentage tests and/or mouthing. Tests to be supervised by the Executive Committee of the Canadian Shorthorn Association. In the event that the veterinarian determines the animal's age is incorrect, that animal will be barred from showing.
6. Shorthorn cattle born in Canada and shown by a Canadian exhibitor must carry Canadian registration papers issued by the Canadian Shorthorn Association. All foreign registration papers will be evaluated according to the Canadian Shorthorn Association's Rules of Eligibility for Registration in Canada.
7. Original registration papers **must** be available on all cattle at the time of weighing.
8. If numbers of entries warrant, classes may be split.

SECTION 175

CLASS

1. Female, purebred, born in 2011. Class will be split.
2. Junior Division, Calf Champion and Reserve Calf Champion Female.
3. Senior Division, Calf Champion and Reserve Calf Champion Female.
4. Female, purebred, born March 1 - December 31, 2010.
5. Female, purebred, born January 1 - February 28, 2010.
6. Junior Champion and Reserve Junior Champion Female.
7. Female, purebred, born in 2009, with her own **natural**, purebred, 2011, tattooed calf at foot. Calf may be of either sex. Cow and calf to be judged as a unit. Calf is not eligible for classes 1 or 11, but is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Breeder's Herd, Get-of-Sire, and Progeny of Dam classes.
8. Female, purebred, born in 2008 or earlier, with her own **natural**, purebred, 2011, tattooed calf at foot. Calf may be of either sex. Cow and calf to be judged as a unit. Calf is not eligible for classes 1 or 11, but is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Breeder's Herd, Get-of-Sire, and Progeny of Dam classes.
9. Senior Champion and Reserve Senior Champion Female.
10. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Female.
11. Bull born in 2011. Class will be split.
12. Junior Division, Calf Champion and Reserve Calf Champion Bull.
13. Senior Division, Calf Champion and Reserve Calf Champion Bull.
14. Bull, purebred, born March 1 - December 31, 2010.

15. Bull, purebred, born January 1 - February 28, 2010.
16. Junior Champion and Reserve Junior Champion Bull.
17. Bull, purebred, born in 2009.
18. Senior Champion and Reserve Senior Champion Bull.
19. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bull.
20. Supreme Champion: Grand Champion Female or Grand Champion Bull - Memorial Trophy.
21. Progeny of Dam: Any two animals of either sex, of any age from the same dam. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. **Name of dam must be listed on the entry form when making entry. No entry fee, but entry must be made.**
22. Breeder's Herd: A group of four animals bred by the exhibitor. Both sexes represented. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. **No entry fee, but entry must be made.**
23. Senior Get-of-Sire: A group of three animals from the same sire. Both sexes represented. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Animals must be shown in the previous single classes. **No entry fee, but entry must be made. Only one calendar calf can be shown, that calf can't be shown in junior Get-of-Sire.**
24. Junior Get-of-Sire: Three animals, get of one sire. Born in 2011. Both sexes represented. Must have been shown in previous single classes. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. **No entry fee, but entry must be made.**
25. Premier Breeder.
26. Premier Exhibitor.

PREMIER BREEDER AND EXHIBITOR AWARDS

Will be calculated as follows: 1st place - 6 points; 2nd place - 5 points; 3rd place - 4 points; 4th place - 3 points; 5th place - 2 points; 6th place - 1 point. Points will be awarded to the top 6 placing animals of each breeder's or exhibitor's string. In the event of a tie, the tie will be broken by placings in the Breeder's Herd class.

Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion do not gain extra points.

Premier Breeder: Points will be allocated to the Breeding unit which bred the animal. A breeding unit is defined as the immediate family breeding cattle under that farm. The members of a breeding unit will be decided by the show and sale committee. Jointly bred cattle are considered as a separate entity. No split points will be awarded.

Premier Exhibitor: The exhibitor must own the animal at the time of entry. In the case of jointly owned animals, points will be awarded to one owner only as specified on the entry form. The responsibility of designating exhibitor, lies with the owner(s) and must be determined at time of entry, and included on that exhibitor's entry form.

SHOW RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules and Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. Entry Fee: \$65/entry. Tie-out Fee: \$15/head. GST payable on all fees.

Eligibility:

1. a) Animals must be registered in the Canadian Shorthorn Association herd book or have Canadian I.D. paper and one parent registered in a recognized herd book with Livestock records.
b) Exhibitor's must be Canadian Shorthorn Association members.
2. A 2 year old and over Cow/calf class will be offered. The cow must have either the sire or dam registered with the Canadian Shorthorn Association.
3. Proof of registered parentage must be presented at time of processing, or have a Canadian I.D. paper.
4. Age requirements as per class description.
5. If numbers warrant classes may be split.
6. Heifers entered in the Prospect Show and Sale that meet the above eligibility may enter into the Shorthorn Plus Show and will be checked for eligibility prior to entering the show ring.
7. All entries must follow the arrival, release and processing times of the Purebred cattle with the exception of those entered into the Prospect Show and Sale. If entry is entered in the Prospect Calf Show and Sale please see that section for arrival, release, and processing times.

1. Female, born in 2011.
2. Female, born in 2010.
3. Female born in 2009 or earlier, with her own natural 2011 calf at foot.
4. Grand Champion Female.
5. Bull, born in 2011.
6. Bull, born in 2010.
7. Bull born in 2009.
8. Grand Champion Bull.

SHORTHORN HERDSMAN AWARD

*A plaque will be awarded by the **Saskatchewan Shorthorn Association** to the herdsman or farm putting on the best display at Agribition. The winner will be declared by a judge, or judges, who when making judgment consider the neatness of the exhibit, the grooming of the cattle and the courtesy displayed by the attendants.*

**Shorthorn Ringmaster's Choice
Rules & Regulations**

1. Eligible cattle: Beef Shorthorn, Lincoln Red and Dual Purpose Shorthorn - all purebred males and females; Graded up Shorthorns of registered status (7/8 females, 15/16 males).
2. Any animal entered in the CWA Shorthorn Show and the CWA Elite Shorthorn Sale is eligible to enter.
3. Fees: \$150.00/animal.
4. Entry Deadline: November 1, 2011. Footnotes and copy of registration papers must be submitted to Diane Schaeffer at the Sask. Shorthorn booth by 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday November 22, 2011.
5. Individuals are allowed to purchase as many vouchers as they want for \$100.00. If not able to attend, proxy forms are available.
6. The winner will select their choice of animal in the show ring, and will receive full interest and possession of the animal. If the winner is exhibiting an animal that is in ownership or in a partnership situation, the animal must leave the show ring before Ringmaster's Choice animal is chosen.
7. Owner of the Ringmaster's Choice animal will be given a \$5,000 cash reward.
8. The Ringmaster's Choice Committee reserves the right to cancel this event if entries do not warrant it. If so entry fees will be refunded.

SHORTHORN SALE RULES

1. **Eligible Cattle:**
 - A) Beef Shorthorn, Lincoln Red and Dual Purpose Shorthorn - all purebred males and females.
 - B) Graded up Shorthorns of registered status. (87.5% 7/8 Females, 93.8% 15/16 Males).
2. Sale entry must be submitted to and received by the Sales Management along with a full colour photograph by September 1.
3. **Fees:** There will be a selection fee of \$75.00/farm location. There will also be a catalogue fee of \$100.00/head, which is refundable upon the sale of the animal.
4. **Registration certificates and signed transfers with complete breeding information on females must accompany sale entry.**
5. Any animal entered and stabled in the Canadian Western Agribition Shorthorn Sale will be sold, but if it is withheld on a protective bid, the regular sale commission will be based on the bid.
6. Sale commission to be determined, and will include 3% to Canadian Western Agribition.
7. All animals to be guaranteed breeders according to the Canadian Shorthorn Association standard guarantees.
8. All Shorthorns entered must be tested TH free. Breeders can declare their animals TH free by pedigree, for all Saskatchewan sanctioned sales.
9. All animals must show to sell.
