High School Rodeo Makes First Agribition Appearance Ever

(Regina) On Monday, November 21, the Saskatchewan High School Rodeo Association (SHSRA) will make history at Canadian Western Agribition, giving youth from across the province a chance to showcase their talents.

The contestants in each event of the High School Division and the top 6 from our Build A Cowboy Program will come back Monday night in a special evening performance.

At 11:00 am, a group of young competitors will demonstrate how they learned to ride bareback and saddle bronc horses.
