Explanation of points:

Soundness - Refers to freedom from injury, such as broken, cracked, hulled, frosted, sprouted, musty or in any way damaged seeds. Samples without current germination or low germination could be penalized under soundness. Sound, well-ripened & matured seeds are essential for producing vigorous, rapidly growing plants.

Plumpness - General plumpness & uniformity of sample & weight per bushel are all scored under plumpness. Plump, well-filled kernels indicate seeds contain ample food for vigorous germination. Small, shrunken seeds may germinate but produce weak, disease prone plants.

Colour - A uniform bright colour indicates sample has been harvested under favourable conditions & adds to the general appearance of the sample. Badly discoloured seeds may affect their vitality.

Freedom from Weed Seeds - Samples should be penalized according to the number and kind of weed seeds present in the sample.

Freedom from Other Grain/Useless Matter - Sample should be penalized according to the number of other kinds of grain and other useless matter, such as straw, sticks, stones, etc. found in the sample.

Freedom from Disease - Any evidence of disease in sample should be penalized according to the severity & number of kernels affected. Entries of peas and lentils without an Ascochyta disease test will be downgraded.

**Seed producers are encouraged to submit samples of kinds/classes not listed –
for display purposes only. If three or more samples of the same kind are received,
the CWA Grain Show Committee will consider creating a new class.**

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The seed lot must be sampled by acceptable sampling procedures and presented to the Canadian Western Agribition without alterations. The lot must be sampled by: an official seed inspector with Canadian Food Inspection Agency or state seed department U.S.A. or by a licensed operator/grader of an authorized establishment as defined by the Canadian or American seed regulations. Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation personnel are also authorized to collect samples.
2. All entries must have a valid Canadian crop certificate number for each entry and an official lab report must accompany each sample both in the sample bag and stapled to the outside of the bag on the identification tag.
3. No entry fee is necessary for the Grain Show competition.
4. No exhibitor may make more than one entry per variety, i.e. an exhibitor can enter a sample of Elsa and a sample of Harvest in class 1, but not two samples of Elsa.
5. The Pedigreed seed must be from 2010 or 2011 pedigreed production and must have been grown on the farm of the exhibitor (a bona fide grower in the case of a firm), and must be entered in the name of the grower with the crop certificate number, with the exception of Canola Seed. The exhibitor of the Canola Seed does not have to be the bona fide grower, it can also be the owner of the exhibited lot. Samples drawn from the same lot or crop certificate numbers that have produced an Agribition Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion exhibits in the previous year are ineligible.
6. An official germination from an accredited laboratory is required for all seed entries and **MUST be reported by November 10, 2011. Any sample without germination test result (obtained within the previous twelve months) on judging day will be downgraded for soundness.**
7. Ascochyta disease testing must be completed for pea, chickpea and lentil samples. Please provide an official disease test result submitted with your official germination. Entries without Ascochyta disease test result will be downgraded under the freedom from disease section.
8. A 2 kg sample (1 kg for forage seeds) must represent a "lot" of seed, which is eligible for the seed competition and which is not less than 2.5 tonnes (approx. 100 bushels, 200 kg. for forage seed.)
9. Treated seed is not eligible for entry. Seed deemed to be cosmetically altered by use of products such as oils shall be disqualified.
10. Sample bags and identification tags are available from Canadian Western Agribition, phone 306-565-0565 or email jsmith@agribition.com.
11. All samples become the possession of respective seed show officials, and will not be returned.
12. Decisions of the judges will be final. Fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, if discovered by officials, will result in disqualification and suspension from the competitions for 3 years following.
13. All entries will be judged. Placement will be according to Judge's discretion.
14. Samples must be sent prepaid and received by Canadian Western Agribition, 2nd Floor Canada Centre Bldg, Evraz Place, Box 3535, Regina, SK S4P 3J8 by **November 10, 2011.**

STEP-BY-STEP PROCEDURE

1. The grower decides what he wishes to exhibit and has lots sampled as required (**refer to regulation #1**).
2. The grower has a 2 kg sample drawn (1 kg for forage seed) & packaged from a "lot" of seed of not less than 2.5 tonnes (approx. 100 bushels, 200 kg for forage seed).
3. Each bag is to be identified with a completed identification tag. Duplicates of the official germination must be signed by the individual authorized to draw the sample, and placed on the outside and on the inside of each sample bag. Please indicate the official sampler by signing: "Sampled by:" and the signature of the official sampler. All samples are to be submitted to Canadian Western Agribition by **November 10, 2011**. Entries to be sent to Canadian Western Agribition, Box 3535, 2nd Floor, Canada Centre Building, Evraz Place, Regina, Saskatchewan S4P 3J8.

RULES & REGULATIONS

This competition is designed to acquaint the exhibitor with the processing aspects of seed quality. Judging will be based on the improvement the exhibitor has made to the combine-run sample provided by the seed grower in terms of sizing, grading and cleanliness. Maximum clean out shall be 30%. Clean out is one of the major decisions pedigreed seed growers must address. Excessive clean out removes valuable seed from the markets and insufficient processing can leave impurities and a poor sample for the market place. Points will be deducted for clean out exceeding 30%. Please read all rules and procedures carefully.

1. The competition is open to any person 21 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2012.
2. Samples are to be prepared by the exhibitor.
3. Samples must be obtained from a Pedigreed Seed Grower and must be of a variety licensed in Canada and hold a valid crop certificate for each entry. In addition, the sample must be identified as to variety and crop certificate number.
4. **Pedigreed Seed Grower's Responsibilities:** the Pedigreed Seed Grower must provide the exhibitor with a 1.0 kg, unprocessed (combine-run) and uncleaned sample. **The grower's signature must appear on the exhibitor's entry form.**
5. **Exhibitor's Responsibilities:**
The exhibitor then takes the 1.0 kg sample and processes it to improve its quality. This must be conducted exclusively by the exhibitor and may include hand processing. Exhibitors are encouraged to consult with the Seed Grower as to how to conduct this processing. Remember, the maximum clean out shall be 30%. (Samples with over 30% clean out will be penalized under the clean out criteria).
6. The exhibitor then submits to Canadian Western Agribition both the processed sample and the material removed during processing. Please ensure that these two samples are well packaged but kept separated to avoid remixing during shipping. **Small zip-lock bags are recommended for submitting the clean out.** Please be sure to identify each of these two samples with exhibitor's identification labels, and have the Pedigreed Seed Grower's signature in the space designated.
7. No exhibitor may make more than one entry per class.
8. All samples submitted become the property of Canadian Western Agribition.
9. No entry fee is required.
10. **The deadline for delivery of samples to Canadian Western Agribition is November 10, 2011.**

PROCESSING

Clean out - Maximum clean out shall be 30%. Clean out is one of the major decisions pedigreed seed growers must address. Excessive clean out removes valuable seed from the markets and insufficient processing can leave impurities and a poor sample for the market place. Samples with over 30% cleanout will be penalized under the clean out criteria.

Soundness - Refers to freedom from injury, such as broken, cracked, hulled, frosted, sprouted, musty or in any way damaged seeds. Sound, well-ripened and matured seeds are essential for producing vigorous, rapid growing plants.

Plumpness - General plumpness and uniformity of sample are both scored under plumpness. Plump, well-filled kernels indicate seeds contain ample food for vigorous germination. Small shrunken seed may germinate but produce weak, disease prone plants.

Freedom from Weed Seeds - Samples should be penalized according to the number and kinds of weed seeds present in the sample.

Freedom from Other Grains/Useless Matter - Sample should be penalized according to the number of other kinds of grain and other useless matter, such as straw, sticks, stones, etc. found in the sample.

GENERAL APPEARANCE

Plumpness - General plumpness and uniformity of sample will also be judged under this section.

Colour - A uniform bright colour indicates sample has been harvested under favorable conditions and adds to the general appearance of the sample. Badly discoloured seeds may affect vitality.

General Appearance (including disease) - Plump, well-filled kernels indicate seeds contain ample food for vigorous germination. Any evidence of disease in sample should be penalized to the severity and number of kernels affected.
