



## CANADIAN WESTERN AGRIBITION NOVEMBER 22 - 27, 2021

### ALPACA SHOW

**SHOW:** 9:00 AM, Tuesday, November 23 – Canada Centre Arena

**JUDGE:** Ken Hibbits, Montara, CA, USA

**HOST HOTEL:** Best Western East Gate. Contact Glenda Shotter at 306-861-9624 to book.

**ARRIVAL:** May start entering the barns 8:00 AM, Sunday, November 21 and must be in the barns by 9:00 PM, Sunday, November 21.

**RELEASE:** May start immediately following the show and must be out of the barns by 9:00 PM, Tuesday, November 23. Exhibitors are required to clean their pens prior to departure.

### SHOW RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. All entries are subject to Alpaca Canada Rules & Regulations. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
3. Entry fee: \$70.00/entry for the halter show. \$40.00/entry for the fleece show. Entry fee includes electrical and judging fees. GST payable on all fees. Deadline October 1.
4. All alpacas entered in the show must be registered with the Canadian Llama and Alpaca Association (CLAA). A copy of the alpaca's CLAA certificate or recorded letter must be readily available at the show.
  - a. Pending registration status is not permitted.
  - b. Percentage purebred alpacas with CLAA certificates of registration are eligible to show.
  - c. CLAA recorded (0%) alpacas are eligible to show provided they have 8 grandparents on a foreign registration certificate.
5. Entries must be made in the name of the animal and owner and must match the registration certificates.
6. All animals must be in good health, be free of communicable diseases, and be current in their inoculations and deworming. Any animal exhibiting symptoms of infection will be refused entry to the show. A vet will be on-call.
7. Only animals entered in this show will be allowed in the barns.
8. If alpaca's birth date is that of the show, the alpaca will be moved up to the next oldest class.
9. Exhibitors are responsible for being at ringside ten minutes prior to the time of their class.
10. Pens: 10ft. x 10ft. pens will be provided. Limit of two yearling alpacas per pen, or two older alpacas. Exhibitors are responsible to provide their own bedding. Straw, shavings, and pellets are available for sale at the show. Sand is not permitted.
11. Pre-screening and Registration Check: Monday, November 22, 10:00 AM to 1:30 PM.
12. Dress code is dark pants or skirt and a light-coloured shirt. No open toed shoes. No ranch, farm, personal, or organizational name or logo shall be worn on exhibitor or animal while in the show ring.
13. Show management reserves the right to combine classes, cancel classes, and remove animals entered in classes which they are not eligible. Classes may be combined at the judge's discretion. There will be no minimal size of class, one animal in the class does not guarantee first place.
14. Alpacas may not be moved from one halter class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the discretion of the judge.
15. No alpaca shall be surgically altered for cosmetic or conformation correction, nor shall drugs or substances be administered to alpacas for the purpose of behavior modification while at the show.
16. Minimum fleece length on Huacaya will be two inches. Other than top knots and tails, there shall be no clipping or shaping of an alpaca's fleece or staple length to resemble a poodle or lion cut.
17. Maximum fleece length on Suri will be eight inches.
18. Junior showmanship class will be held after regular classes (ribbons will be provided to 4<sup>th</sup> place).
19. All first and second place ribbon winners will compete for Color Champion and Reserve Color Champion. All Color Champion winners will compete for Supreme Champion.

20. Exhibitors are cautioned to quarantine their show animals after coming home from shows and to not share buckets with other exhibitors at the show. Please consult your veterinarian for quarantine time. We also emphasize only healthy alpacas be entered.

## **HALTER ENTRIES**

Age divisions for halter classes will be as follows and will be determined by the age of the animal on the first day of the show:

1. Juvenile – 6 months to under 12 months.
2. Yearling – 12 months to under 24 months.
3. Two-year-old – 24 months to under 36 months.
4. Mature – 36 months and over.

Colour classes are as follows:

1. Grey (includes silver grey, rose grey)
2. Black (includes bay black, black)
3. Brown (includes light brown, medium brown, dark brown)
4. Fawn (includes medium fawn, dark fawn)
5. Light (includes beige, light fawn)
6. White
7. Multi (exhibits two or more colours that are distinct and immediately visible where the colours are situated on the alpaca below the mid-neckline and above the knees).

If an alpaca has a single spot at skin level less than 3 cm in diameter below the mid-neckline and above the knees, the alpaca will go into its predominant colour class.

**\*Multi's are left to the discretion of the show committee of first place winners to compete as Best Multi-Champion Award or in the Color Champion/Supreme Champion award\***

## **SECTION 320**

### **CLASSES (Grey, Black, Brown, Fawn, Light, White & Multi)**

- Juvenile Female
- Yearling Female
- Two-year-old Female
- Mature Female
- Color Champion Female and Reserve Color Champion Female- This class will be held only if there is a minimum of 6 alpacas of the same colour in 2 age divisions
- Juvenile Male
- Yearling Male
- Two-year-old Male
- Mature Male
- Color Champion Male and Reserve Color Champion Male- This class will only be held if there is a minimum of 6 alpacas of the same colour in 2 age divisions

### **Youth Classes**

- Junior Showmanship- 12 and under as of December 31 of the current year
- Senior Showmanship- 13 to 16 years of age as of December 31 of the current year

### **Group Classes**

- Get-of-Sire: A group of three animals from the same sire and at least two different dams. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. No entry fee, but entry must be made in the name of the sire.

- Produce-of-Dam: A group of two animals from the same dam and different sires. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. No entry fee, but entry must be made in the name of the dam.

**Special Classes** – The 1<sup>st</sup> place from each class of that age compete for age champion:

**\*this class will only be held if there is a minimum of 3 alpacas of the same age division\***

- Champion Juvenile Female
- Champion Yearling Female
- Champion two-year- old Female
- Champion Mature Female
- Champion Juvenile Male
- Champion Yearling Male
- Champion Two-year-old Male
- Champion Mature Male

### **Supreme Champion**

- Supreme Female
  - Supreme Male
- \*if there is no color champion then first place in that color will compete\***

## FLEECE ENTRIES

The Fleece Show Committee requests that each fleece shown shall:

Consist of the prime blanket fibre only and shall be displayed skirted of all short, stained and extremely course fibre. Heavy organic contamination should be removed as well.

Be rolled cut side out and transported in clear plastic bags, along with the completed identification form.

Fleeces will be judged on fineness and handle; character; luster; density; uniformity of: micron, colour, and length throughout fleece; lack of medullated fibres or guard hair; lack of impurities/stain/tip damage/ and clean fleece weight. Sexes are judged together.

Single entry classes must have a minimum score of 60 points to be awarded a first-place ribbon.

Prizes: Ribbons will be awarded in each class from 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup>.

Entry fee: \$40 per fleece entry.

Entry deadline is October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. Entries must be received at SABN by November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021.

Age divisions for fleece classes will be as follows and will be determined by the age of the animal on the day of shearing the fleece entered:

1. A - 6 months to under 14 months
2. B - 14 months to under 24 months
3. C - 24 months to under 4 years
4. D - 4 years to under 6 years
5. E - over 6 years
