SHOW & SALE RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. Entry fee: Single Entry: Bulls \$200.00/entry (show and sale); Single or Pens of Two: \$125.00/entry (show and sale). Fees to be paid to the Canadian Bison Association. This includes a fee of \$50.00/head to Canadian Western Agribition. GST payable on all fees.
3. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the Canadian Bison Association.
4. Entry Deadline: Entries and fees to be sent by mail, fax, or delivered to Canadian Bison Association: Suite 200 – 1660 Pasqua St, PO Box 3116, Regina SK S4P 3G7. Phone: 306-522-4766, Fax: 306-522-4768, between September 1 and 5:00 PM, October 1, 2021. No phone entries will be accepted.
5. Entry Limits:
 - Yearling bull class: Max 15
 - Two-year-old bull class: Max 7
 - Single yearling heifers: Max 7
 - Pen of Two Bred Heifers: Max 7 pens
 - Single Bred Heifers: Max 7
 - Pen of Two Yearling Heifers, max 7 pensThe committee's goal, by setting the above limits, is to improve the overall quality and variety in the show and sale. Limits per consignor will be strictly enforced. Exhibitors will be restricted to a maximum of two entries per class and classes may be cancelled if there are insufficient entries.
6. Weight: There are no weight requirements, however, the following are average weights from the last three years that consignors should consider when selecting animals for entry:
 - Yearling bulls: average weight 1125 pounds
 - Yearling heifers: average weight 850 pounds
 - Bred two-year-old heifers: average weight 1125 pounds
 - Two-year-old bulls: average weight 1500 pounds
 - Pen of two heifer calves: average weight 400 pounds
 - Pen of two yearling heifers: average weight 800 pounds
7. Horns: Both horned and dehorned animals will be accepted. Broken, bleeding horns upon arrival will not be accepted.
8. Ear Tags: One Canadian National Bison Show & Sale ear tag will be supplied per animal by the Canadian Bison Association and assigned to each animal consigned to the Show & Sale. The Canadian Nationals Bison Show & Sale tags MUST be accompanied by a CBA bison specific CCIA tag. All ranch identification ear tags must be removed.
9. Animals not meeting the show and sale requirements (due to injury or poor condition) may be rejected by the Yard Supervisor. The Yard Supervisor's decision shall be final.

10. Bison to arrive at Canadian Western Agribition no earlier than 1:00 PM, Friday, November 19, and will be stalled in the assigned pens in the Commercial Cattle Barn. All bison to be accommodated by 6:00 PM, Saturday, November 20. Bison will be released prior to 9:00AM and after 5:00 PM Tuesday, November 23. **BISON WILL NOT BE RELEASED WHILE GATES ARE OPEN TO PUBLIC.** Bison must be out of the barns by 9:00AM, Wednesday, November 24.
11. Commission: A commission of 10% plus GST (which includes 3% to CWA) will be deducted from the gross sale price of each animal sold at auction.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection: Required for each animal and must be signed by an accredited veterinarian. Animals should be treated for internal and external parasites. (There are no anti-parasitic drugs marketed in Canada approved for use in bison. The selection of drugs to be used should be discussed with your veterinarian.)
2. All bison entering shows and/or sales must be identified with an approved CCIA tag (series specific – i.e. series 300-304).
3. A “Record of Movement” is required by the Canadian Bison Association for all entries.
4. Pregnancy Tests: An acceptable test performed by your veterinarian. All bred two-year-olds must be verified as bred and safe with calf 60 days prior to the sale. All yearling heifers must be verified as being open.
5. Semen Test: All yearling and two-year-old bulls must be accompanied by a semen evaluation signed by an accredited veterinarian stating the animal is a satisfactory breeder.
6. Age: All bison ages must be verified by an accredited veterinarian and indicated on the Health Certificate. A teething chart will be provided.
7. Hormones: The consignor warrants that there has been no use of growth hormones and that the animals shown or to be born to the animal shown are the product of natural breeding.

LIABILITY

1. The consignor assumes all responsibilities in regard to the above-mentioned terms and conditions of this show and sale including, but not limited to: proper health testing and documentation, proper documentation of a positive pregnancy test (where applicable), and documentation of age. The CBA acts only as an agent and will assume no responsibility in the event of injury to or death of an animal, or of a discrepancy between buyer and consignor.
2. Judges reserve the right to disqualify any animal from the show or sale if, in their opinion, the animal appears to be diseased, in an unhealthy condition, or of a wrong age.
3. The Canadian Bison Association, its officers, agents, or employees assume **no responsibility** for any animal before, during, or after the Canadian Bison Show & Sale.

2. Two-year-old bull, born 2019.
3. Female, open yearling, born 2020.
4. Female, bred two-year-old, born 2019.
5. Pen of Two bred two-year-olds, born 2019.
6. Pen of Two open yearling heifers, born 2020.
7. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bull – Rosettes.
8. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Heifer – Rosettes.
9. Premier Exhibitor.
10. Rookie of the Year.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR

PREMIER EXHIBITOR: Will be awarded based on a point system. Grand & Reserve Grand Champions will be awarded extra points. **In the event of a tie, the judges shall determine the winner.**

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Will be awarded to a first-time consignor. Criteria will be the same as determining the Premier Exhibitor Award.
