SHOW RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. Entry fee: \$85.00/entry. Tie-Out Fee: \$30.00/head. GST payable on all fees. Deadline October 1.
3. Important! All animals entered and shown **MUST** be registered in the Canadian Hereford Association herd book or the herd book of a Member Association of the World Hereford Council. All animals must have a legible tattoo which corresponds to their registration paper.
4. Current Year Calf Class: A ribbon or prize money class, which must be provided at all shows held between August 1 and December 31. The calf is eligible to show in the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion classes. Calves must be a minimum of three months of age. A calf from the 2-year-old female calf class and the cow/calf class may be shown individually in Get-of-Sire and Breeder's Herd classes at Mark Of Excellence (MOE) shows. If the show is under 75 head of cattle, the show committee may also allow calves from the 2-year-old female and the cow/calf class to be shown individually in the Current Year Calf Class. If the show is over 75 head, a heifer calf can be entered two ways (calf class and pair class). Depending on the show order, decided by the MOE show committee, heifer calves that win the honor of Grand or Reserve Grand Heifer Calf Champion may not be shown as a pair; or heifer calves on a Grand or Reserve Grand Champion cow may not be shown individually in the heifer calf class. A bull calf can be shown both ways.
5. Weights and Measurements: During arrival period, all cattle must be weighed. Scrotal measurements will be taken on pertinent aged bulls by qualified personnel.
6. Splitting of classes will be done after all entries are weighed.
7. Important! Exhibitors **MUST** wear show harness and the red Canadian Hereford Association show jacket/shirt in the show ring. All weights and current EPD's must be posted as soon as cattle are processed.
8. Horned and Polled Hereford Herdsman Award will be made to the herdsman/exhibitor presenting the best display and attitude during Canadian Western Agribition, selected by the Hereford Barn Boss.

SECTION 135 (HORNED) OR 140 (POLLED)

CLASS

1. Female, born in 2021.
2. Junior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Heifer Calf.
3. Senior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Heifer Calf.
4. Female, born in 2020.
5. Champion and Reserve Champion Yearling Heifer.
6. Female, born in 2019 with her own 2021, natural, purebred, tattooed, registered calf at foot. Calf may be of either sex. Cow and calf to be judged as a unit. Calf is not eligible for class 1.
7. Female, born in 2018 or earlier with her own 2021, natural, purebred, tattooed, registered calf at foot. Calf may be of either sex. Cow and calf to be judged as a unit. Calf is not eligible for class 1.
8. Champion and Reserve Champion Senior Female.
9. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Female.
10. Bull, born in 2021.
11. Junior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Bull Calf.
12. Senior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Bull Calf.
13. Bull, born in 2020.
14. Champion and Reserve Champion Yearling Bull.
15. Bull, born in 2019.
16. Champion and Reserve Champion Senior Bull.
17. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bull.
18. Breeder's Herd: A group of four animals bred by the exhibitor. Both sexes represented. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor. Limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
19. Get-of-Sire: A group of three animals, any age, from the same sire. Both sexes represented. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. Limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
20. Junior Get-of-Sire: three animals, get of one sire. Born in 2021, both sexes represented. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Animals must have been shown in previous single classes. No entry fee, but entry must be made. May also show in class 18.
21. Premier Breeder.
22. Premier Exhibitor.

PREMIER BREEDER AND EXHIBITOR AWARDS

Premier Breeder and Exhibitor Awards will be calculated as follows: 1st place – 7 points; 2nd place – 6 points; 3rd place – 5 points; 4th place – 4 points; 5th place – 3 points; 6th place – 2 points; 7th place – 1 point.

PREMIER BREEDER:

A banner is presented to the individual or company (as recorded on the certificate of Registration) whose animals accumulate the highest total points based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award, the breeder must exhibit at the show. Qualification for this award is based on Canadian rules that specify all owners at the time of conception are the breeders of the animal. There is no minimum number of head shown in order to be eligible to qualify for Premier Breeder.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR: A banner is presented to the breeding unit (exhibitor) with the most total points for animals owned and shown by the breeding unit based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. All animals accumulating points for this award must be the entries of one breeding unit. A breeding unit (exhibitor) is defined as "that person whose name appears on the Certificate of

Registration as the owner or partner," and who pays the entry fee, and has the animal in their show ring. There is no minimum number of head shown in order to be eligible to qualify for Premier Exhibitor.

In the event of a tie for Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor, the breeder/exhibitor with the highest placing breeder's her in class will be declared the winner.

AGRIBITION HERDSMAN AWARD presented by TROUW NUTRITION

Banners will be awarded to herdsmen or farm exhibitors putting on the best display during the period of Canadian Western Agribition. A winner in each breed will be declared by an impartial judge who has been requested when making judgement to consider the neatness of the exhibit, the grooming of the animals, and the courtesy of the attendants.
