SHOW RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. Entry fee: \$85.00/entry. Tie-Out Fee: \$30.00/head. GST payable on all fees. Deadline October 1.
3. All bulls must use a nose ring or humbug at all times.
4. All animals must be registered or recorded in the country of origin and carry registration papers from the Canadian Maine-Anjou Association or the American Maine-Anjou Association.
5. The use of any **PAINT** product is not allowed in the Maine- Anjou show. This rule will be strictly enforced and any animal in violation will be excused from the show.

SECTION 150 PUREBRED or FULLBLOOD CLASSES

1. Female, purebred or fullblood, born in 2020.
2. Champion and Reserve Champion, Purebred of Fullblood, Yearling Heifer.
3. Female, purebred or fullblood, born in 2019 with her own 2021 natural, tattooed, registered purebred or fullblood calf at side. Calf is eligible for any individual calf classes. However, the heifer calf on the Senior Champion is not eligible to compete in the heifer calf class.
4. Female, purebred or fullblood, born in 2018 or earlier with her own 2021 natural, tattooed, registered purebred or fullblood calf at side. Calf is eligible for any individual calf classes. However, the heifer calf on the Senior Champion is not eligible to compete in the heifer calf class.
5. Champion and Reserve Champion, Purebred or Fullblood, Senior Female.
6. Female, purebred born January 1 to July 15, 2021.



7. Female, fullblood born January 1 to July 15, 2021.
8. Champion and Reserve Champion, Purebred or Fullblood, Heifer Calf.
9. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion, Purebred or Fullblood, Female.
10. Bull, purebred, born January 1 to July 15, 2021.
11. Bull, fullblood, born January 1 to July 15, 2021.
12. Champion and Reserve Champion, Purebred or Fullblood, Bull Calf.
13. Bull, purebred or fullblood, born in 2020.
14. Champion and Reserve Champion, Purebred or Fullblood, Yearling Bull.
15. Bull, purebred or fullblood, born in 2019.
16. Champion and Reserve Champion, Purebred or Fullblood, Senior Bull.
17. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion, Purebred of Fullblood, Bull.
18. Get-of-Sire: A group of three purebred or fullblood animals from the same sire. Both sexes represented. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
19. Progeny-of-Dam (the dam and at least one progeny must be owned by the exhibitor): Two animals from one dam; animals must have been shown in the regular classes. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
20. Breeder's Herd: A group of four purebred or fullblood animals bred by the exhibitor. Both sexes represented; must have been exhibited in previous single classes. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor. Limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
21. Best Pair of Bulls of any age, purebred or fullblood. Both bulls must be bred and owned by the Exhibitor and must be entered in any of the following classes: 10, 11, 13, or 15. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
22. Premier Breeder.
23. Premier Exhibitor.

SECTION 150P PERCENTAGE CLASSES (Champions will not qualify for Supreme show)

1. Female, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2020.
2. Champion and Reserve Champion, Percentage, Yearling Heifer.
3. Female, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2019 with her own 2021 natural, tattooed, registered calf at side. Calf is eligible to show in any other single classes. However, the heifer calf on the Senior Champion is not eligible to compete in the heifer calf class.
4. Female, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2018 with her own 2021 natural, tattooed, registered calf at side. Calf is eligible to show in any other single classes. However, the heifer calf on the Senior Champion is not eligible to compete in the heifer calf class.
5. Champion and Reserve Champion, Percentage, Senior Female.
6. Female, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2021.
7. Champion and Reserve Champion, Percentage, Heifer Calf.
8. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion, Percentage, Female.
9. Bull, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2021.
10. Champion and Reserve Champion, Percentage, Bull Calf.
11. Bull, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2020.
12. Champion and Reserve Champion, Percentage, Yearling Bull.
13. Bull, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4 born in 2019.
14. Champion and Reserve Champion, Percentage, Senior Bull.
15. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Percentage Bull.
16. Best Pair of Bulls, 1/4, 3/8, 1/2, 5/8, or 3/4, any age. Both bulls must be bred and owned by the Exhibitor and must be entered in any of the following classes: 9, 11 or 13. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
