PROSPECT STEER & HEIFER SHOW: 5:00 PM, Friday, November 26 – Chevrolet GMC Arena

PROSPECT STEER & HEIFER SALE: 1:30 PM, Saturday, November 27 – John Deere Sale Arena

ARRIVAL: May enter the barns 3:00 PM, Friday, November 19 and must be stabled by 8:00 AM, Monday, November 22 or may enter the barns 7:00 PM Tuesday, November 23 and must be stabled by 8:00 AM, Wednesday, November 24.

WEIGHING & PROCESSING OF PROSPECT CALVES: Exhibitors will be notified of the time and place for weighing and processing following the closing of entries. Preconditioning forms and Livestock Owner's Certificate must accompany the animal at processing.

PRIZE MONEY: Grand Champion \$600.00; Reserve Grand Champion \$400.00

SHOW & SALE RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. Completed online entry form and payment of fees must be received by October 1.
3. Entry Fee: \$85.00/entry. Tie Out Fee: \$30.00/head. GST payable on all fees.
4. Eligible animals: Maximum 60 head steers or heifers.
 - Steer Calves, born in 2021. Calves must be dehorned and castrated. All calves will be physically checked during weighing to ensure proper castration and dehorning.
 - Heifer Calves, born in 2021. All heifers must be guaranteed by their consignor to be open, of replacement quality, and carry a standard breeding guarantee. Heifers selling as purebred must be accompanied by original papers and signed transfers. All prospect calves **MUST** sell in the Prospect sale.
5. All prospect calves **MUST** be preconditioned on the CWA Certified Preconditioned Program. Preconditioning requirements:
 - Cattle must be owned for 60 days by the exhibitor who is preconditioning them.
 - Calves must be weaned and on feed by entry deadline.
 - Castration and dehorning must be completed 30 days prior to the sale.
 - Calves must be over 4 months of age at time of vaccination.
 - All vaccinations must be administered at least 3 weeks prior to the sale.
 - Vaccinations required:
 - Clostridial 7- or 8-way.
 - Histophilus somni vaccination: Two doses administered according to the manufacturer's recommendations; the second dose administered at least 3 weeks prior to the sale.
 - Mannheimia haemolytica vaccine administered according to manufacturer's recommendations.
 - IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV vaccination: either one dose of a modified live vaccine or two doses of an inactivated vaccine administered according to the manufacturer's recommendations; the second dose administered at least 3 weeks prior to the sale.
 - Cattle must be treated for internal and external parasites at least 3 weeks prior to the sale.
 - All calves must bear a CCIA tag upon arrival and **MUST** be individually identified with the nine-digit CCIA number recorded on the Preconditioning Form in order to show and sell.
 - You are not required to have vaccines administered or tags applied by a veterinarian.
6. Preconditioning form and Livestock Ownership Certificate must accompany the cattle upon arrival. [Click here for form.](#)

7. Entries are subject to selection by a committee after arrival at Canadian Western Agribition. Entries showing signs of unhealthiness, disease, including infectious skin diseases (ringworm, etc) will be culled.
8. Calves to be stalled in designated area. Purebred heifers in Breed Shows must be moved to the Prospect area.
9. Clipping is allowed, and all calves must be halter broken. Rope or nylon halter must be provided with each calf.
10. CWA ear tags will be mailed out after October 1. Calves **MUST** arrive tagged at time of weighing and processing with the CWA ear tags. These tags **MUST** be on the animal for the show and sale.
11. Steer calves will be divided into classes based on weight. Heifer calves will be divided into classes based on age. Ribbons will be awarded to fourth place in each class.
12. All steers and heifers showing at Agribition must be sold in the Prospect Steer & Heifer Sale following the show. However, eligibility for the sale will be at the discretion of the committee and any animal deemed unsuitable for the sale will be removed from the barn. Entry fee will not be refunded.
13. Show placing will determine sale order (steers will sell first, followed by heifers). Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions will sell first (owners of these calves have the option to sell all or a portion of their show strings at this time). The committee will determine the remaining sale order.
14. Sale Commission: 5% plus GST to Canadian Western Agribition. Canadian Western Agribition provides as a venue only and has no responsibility to either the seller or the buyer.
15. Settlement for calves must be made immediately following the sale. No calves will be released until proper settlement has been made. A Bill of Sale is required to remove animal from the grounds.
16. **Manifests must be properly filled out and submitted at time of processing. CWA will make cheques payable to the name on the manifests. No exceptions.**
17. Immediately following the sale, calves will be returned to their stalls. Exhibitors are responsible to look after their prospect calves until the calves are picked up by the new owner, or until 6:00 PM, Saturday, November 27.
18. Buyer numbers are not required for the Prospect Calf Sale.

PROSPECT CALF SHOW SPECIALS

THE SASKATCHEWAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION offers a \$200.00 certificate to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Prospect Steer and Heifer, and a \$100.00 certificate to the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion. These awards are made provided the winners are 50% or more Angus, declared at time of entry, and show Angus characteristics. Certificates may be used toward purchase at any Angus sale in Saskatchewan within twenty-four months.

THE CANADIAN CHAROLAIS ASSOCIATION offers \$500.00 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Prospect Steer, and \$250.00 to the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion Prospect Steer. These awards are made subject to the winners being sired by a registered or recorded Charolais bull, declared at time of entry, and visually carrying strong Charolais characteristics (proof of registration maybe requested upon arrival). Winners must be the result of ten or more calves shown in inter-breed competition. Prize money may be withheld if tampering is suspected or proven.

THE MANITOBA-SASKATCHEWAN GELBVIEWH ASSOCIATION will provide a \$100 cash award to the prospect class winners, \$500 to the Grand Champion prospect steer or heifer, and \$250 to the reserve champion prospect steer or heifer, provided the animal in question is sired by a purebred, registered Gelbvieh bull and papers are provided if requested. Breed must be stated at time of entry

THE CANADIAN MAINE-ANJOU ASSOCIATION offers \$150.00 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Prospect Show Calf, and \$100.00 to the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion. These awards are made subject to the animals showing Maine-Anjou influence, declared at the time of entry.

THE CANADIAN SHORTHORN ASSOCIATION offers \$500.00 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Prospect Calf, and \$250.00 to the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion. These awards are made provided the calves are 50% or more Shorthorn breeding, declared at time of entry, and show strong Shorthorn characteristics.

THE SASKATCHEWAN SHORTHORN ASSOCIATION offers a \$250.00 certificate for credit to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Prospect Calf, and a \$100.00 certificate to the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion. These awards are made provided the winners are one-half or better Shorthorn breeding, so declared at time of entry, and show strong Shorthorn characteristics. The credit may be used towards the purchase of Shorthorn animals at any Shorthorn sanctioned sale in Saskatchewan within one year. Calves purchased displaying a Shorthorn sticker on their stall card and who have stated Shorthorn breeding at time of entry, the **purchaser** will receive a \$250.00 certificate towards the purchase of a Shorthorn animal at either of the Saskatchewan Shorthorn sanctioned sales (Agribition or the Shorthorn Alliance Sale in Saskatoon). The certificate will be valid until December 30 of the following year.

THE SASKATCHEWAN SIMMENTAL ASSOCIATION offers \$250.00 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Prospect Steer or Heifer, and \$100.00 to Reserve Grand Champion Prospect Steer or Heifer. This award is made subject to the winners being 50% or more Simmental, and so declared at the time of entry. Prizes may be withheld if tampering is suspected or proven.
