### SHOW RULES

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of Canadian Western Agribition. Please refer to these rules and read them carefully.
2. Entry fee: \$85.00/entry. Tie-Out Fee: \$30.00/head. GST payable on all fees. Deadline October 1.
3. Eligible Cattle:
  - a. Beef Shorthorn, Lincoln Red, and Dual Purpose Shorthorn – all purebred males and females.
  - b. Graded-up Shorthorns of registered status (87.5% 7/8 Females; 93.8% 15/16 Males).
  - c. All cattle entered in the First Lady Classic, President's Classis, and if deemed eligible, the Agribition Beef Supreme must indicate "Purebred" on their registration papers.
4. Any Shorthorns shown at Canadian Western Agribition are subject to parentage tests and/or mouthing. Tests to be supervised by the Executive Committee of the Canadian Shorthorn Association. If the veterinarian determines the animal's age is incorrect, that animal will be barred from showing.
5. Shorthorn cattle born in Canada and shown by a Canadian exhibitor must carry Canadian registration papers issued by the Canadian Shorthorn Association/ all foreign registration papers will be evaluated according to the Canadian Shorthorn Association's Rules of Eligibility for Registration in Canada.
6. It is encouraged that all show cattle have the purple Shorthorn RFID tags in the ear. Other tags are acceptable for this year only. The purple tags are available from the Canadian Shorthorn Association.
7. If numbers of entries warrant, classes may be split.
8. **Exhibitors must be in good standing with Canadian memberships current (out of country exhibitors exempt) and with Canadian Western Agribition. (ie: All entries paid and commissions on animals sold and passed at sales paid).**

## SECTION 175

### CLASS

1. Female, purebred, born March 1 to July 15, 2021.
2. Junior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Heifer Calf.
3. Female, purebred, born January 1 to February 29, 2021.
4. Senior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Heifer Calf.
5. Female, purebred, born March 1 to December 31, 2020.
6. Junior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Yearling Heifer.
7. Female, purebred, born January 1 to February 28, 2020.
8. Senior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Yearling Heifer.
9. Female, purebred, born in 2019, with her own 2021 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot. Calf may be of either sex. Cow and calf to be judged as a unit. Calf is not eligible for classes 1, 3, 13 or 15.
10. Female, purebred, born in 2018 or earlier, with her own 2021 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot. Calf may be of either sex. Cow and calf to be judged as a unit. Calf is not eligible for classes 1, 3, 13 or 15.
11. Champion and Reserve Champion Senior Female.
12. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Female.
13. Bull, purebred, born March 1 to July 15, 2021.
14. Junior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Bull Calf.
15. Bull, purebred, born January 1 to February 29, 2021.
16. Senior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Bull Calf.
17. Bull, purebred, born March 1 to December 31, 2020.
18. Junior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Yearling Bull.
19. Bull, purebred, born January 1 to February 28, 2020.
20. Senior Division, Champion and Reserve Champion Yearling Bull.
21. Bull, purebred, born in 2019.
22. Champion and Reserve Champion Senior Bull.
23. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bull.
24. Progeny-of-Dam: Any two animals of either sex, of any age from the same dam. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. Name of dam must be listed on the entry form when making entry. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
25. Breeder's Herd: A group of four animals bred by the exhibitor. Both sexes represented. Must have been exhibited in previous classes. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. No entry fee, but entry must be made.
26. Get-of-Sire: A group of three animals from the same sire, both sexes represented. Must have been exhibited in previous single classes. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. No entry fee, but entry must be made. Multiple entries in this case are permitted.
27. Premier Breeder.
28. Premier Exhibitor.

## **PREMIER BREEDER AND EXHIBITOR AWARDS**

Premier Breeder and Exhibitor Awards will be calculated as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> place – 6 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> place – 5 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> place – 4 points; 4<sup>th</sup> place – 3 points; 5<sup>th</sup> place – 2 points; 6<sup>th</sup> place – 1 point. Points will be awarded to the top 6 placing animals of each breeder's or exhibitor's string. In the event of a tie, the tie will be broken by placings in the Breeder's Herd class. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion do not gain extra points.

### **PREMIER BREEDER**

Points will be allocated to the breeding unit which bred the animal. A breeding unit is described as the immediate family breeding cattle under that farm. The members of a breeding unit will be decided by the show and sale committee. Jointly bred cattle are considered a separate entity. No split points will be awarded.

### **PREMIER EXHIBITOR**

The exhibitor must own the animal at the time of entry. In the case of jointly owned animals, points will be awarded to one owner only as specified on the entry form. The responsibility of designating exhibitor lies with the owner(s) and must be determined at time of entry and included on that exhibitor's entry form.

## **AGRIBITION HERDSMAN AWARD presented by TROUW NUTRITION**

Banners will be awarded to herdsmen or farm exhibitors putting on the best display during the period of Canadian Western Agribition. A winner in each breed will be declared by an impartial judge who has been requested when making judgement to consider the neatness of the exhibit, the grooming of the animals, and the courtesy of the attendants.

# SHORTHORN SALE

**SALE:** 2:00 PM, Thursday, November 25 – John Deere Sale Arena

## SALE RULES

1. Eligible Cattle:
  - a. Beef Shorthorn, Lincoln Red, and Dual Purpose Shorthorn – all purebred males and females.
  - b. Graded-up Shorthorns of registered status (87.5% 7/8 Females; 93.8% 15/16 Males).
2. Sale entry must be submitted to and received by the sale management along with a full colour photograph by September 1.
3. Fees: There will be a selection fee of \$150/farm location. *There is no upfront fee as the fees will be taken from proceeds.*
4. Registration certificates and signed transfers with complete breeding information on females must accompany sale entry.
5. Any animal entered and stabled in the Canadian Western Agribition Shorthorn Sale will be sold, but if it is withheld on a protective bid, **the regular sale commission will be based on that bid.**
6. Sale commissions to be determined and will include 3% to Canadian Western Agribition.
7. All animals to be guaranteed breeders according to the Canadian Shorthorn Association standard guarantees.
8. All Shorthorns entered must be tested TH free. Breeders can declare their animals TH free by pedigree for all Saskatchewan sanctioned sales.
9. All animals must show to sell.
